People Who Care is the July Charity of the Month. This organization provides essential transportation and non-medical assistance to adults in the Quad Cities who are unable to drive due to age, vision issues or disability.

Our volunteer drivers provide welcome companionship while taking their clients to medical appointments and the supermarket. Our assistance allows people to stay independent in their own homes and communities. Thanks to our dedicated volunteers and donors, we are able to provide these services free of charge.

The funds we receive enable us to provide our 435 current clients, whom we call Neighbors, with assistance. Our assistance comes in the form of transportation to essential appointments, grocery shopping either with, for, or order/pick up/delivery, non-medical family caregiver relief, personal paperwork, friendly home visits and phone calls, home safety, minor home repairs, 911 alerts, Technology Assistance, Pet to Vet, and support groups. As a local agency we don't have the luxury of national organizations to back us, and as we are honored to serve an older population, 56 percent are over 80 for instance, our appeal for funds is more of a challenge. We don't have those cute little puppies or kittens, or children of any age that prompt people to donate-because old people are invisible. We have the real lives of aging adults whose lives are made better for the Volunteers who assist them one person at a time.

Hello RWOP members:

As I had to meet the deadline for my July President's Message prior to Friday, June 24th, I felt the need to send along this additional message. I knew a decision from the United States Supreme Court on Roe vs. Wade would be forthcoming. When I first heard the Court's decision to overturn the landmark abortion ruling Roe vs. Wade, I was overcome with a combination of emotions. First, disbelief, that we actually had a Court that had the courage to recognize that a ruling that was made back in 1973 was wrong and stood up to correct it. (No matter what you think of Donald Trump, he promised, if elected, he would appoint Justices to the Supreme Court that would overturn Roe vs. Wade and he kept his promise!) Then apprehension, we have been fighting for so long to stop, in my opinion, one of the greatest crimes against humanity and with this monumental ruling, I knew that the backlash from the left would be horrendous. I was right! All across America and here in Arizona, late into the evening as our legislature was in session trying to finalize the State budget, a sizable group of violent protestors demonstrated and banged on windows of the Arizona Senate building. Law Enforcement Officers were forced to use tear gas to try and disburse the protestors. The Legislators were moved to a secure room in order to be safe and continue voting on the budget. The violent protestors then moved to other parts of the Capital grounds where they did considerable damage to our monuments and threatened Law Enforcement. I texted Senator Fann and Representative Nguyen to see if they were safe. Much later that evening, they both responded that they were OK but it was a very scary situation and were grateful for the actions of Law Enforcement to protect them.

Now we hear some of our country's Representatives saying they will not abide by the Supreme Court ruling and are looking for ways to over rule it. We see protestors calling for "nights of rage" against American communities in retaliation for overturning Roe vs. Wade.

The United States Supreme Court rulings always used to be the final say in court cases. Like it or not, the decisions they rendered were accepted and used as case law to follow for future court cases. Once again, the left has demonstrated that if the decision rendered doesn't align with their ideology, they seek to cause violence, harm and fear to intimidate anyone who disagrees with them. Some people say we are headed for a civil war. Excuse me, the war is already here.

As a member of the Republican Women of Prescott you belong to the third largest Federated Women's clubs in the country and the largest, by far, in Arizona. Currently, there are approximately 1000 total members including about 175 men and 4 to 8 students. We became a Federated club in 1942. Eighty years ago, this year!

The Republican Women of Prescott's mission is dedicated to promoting the principles of the Republican Party, through an informed electorate, by educating and empowering its members, and by electing Republicans to local, state and national offices. VOTE YES FOR SCR1012

On Nov. 8, Arizona voters will decide a measure making multiple changes to Arizona's voter identification and mail-in ballot policies.

The measure would require a voter to include their date of birth and voter identification number for mail-in ballots, in addition to the existing signature requirement. Election officials would check the dates of birth and identification numbers, which would be concealed within the vote-by-mail envelope, against voter registration records. Any of the following could be used as the voter identification number for mail-in ballots under the measure:

- a driver's license or non-operating identification license number,
- the last four digits of a social security number, or
- a unique identifying number provided by the secretary of state for voter registration purposes.

Arizona's Citizens Clean Elections Commission estimated that 89% of voters cast 2020 ballots using early voting, mail-in ballots.

The measure would also eliminate the existing alternative to photo ID for in-person voting that allows a voter to present two documents with their name and address but no photograph.

Rep. John Kavanagh (R) said, concerning the existing mail-in system that requires the voter's signature, that examples of voters' signatures are too readily available. Kavanagh stated, "This bill closes a weak link in the security chain of our election system."

SCR 1012 would amend certain provisions of Proposition 200, a citizen initiative Arizona voters approved in 2004. In Arizona, the legislature cannot amend or repeal a citizen initiative without putting the measure on the ballot for voter approval. California is the only other state besides Arizona that prohibits the legislature from amending or repealing citizen initiatives without voter approval.

The measure was the 70th statewide measure certified for 2022 ballots across 31 states. It is currently the only certified ballot measure that addresses voter identification laws. Additionally, voter ID-related initiatives have been approved for signature gathering in California, Michigan, Nebraska, and Nevada.
