October Program Programs – TeriAnn 1st VP



RWOP is honored to have Attorney General Mark Brnovich, as the October guest speaker!

Brnovich currently serves as Arizona's 26th Attorney General. He was first inaugurated in 2015, and again in 2019 after winning re-election. Mark has spent most of his professional life serving as a prosecutor at the local, state, and federal levels. Mark met his wife Susan while they both worked as prosecutors for the Maricopa County Attorney's office. Mark worked in the Gang/Repeat Offender Unit and prosecuted many difficult and high-profile cases from 1992 to 1998. He then went on to work as an Assistant Attorney General with the Arizona Attorney General's Office from 1998 to 2003, where he developed an expertise in gambling law. Brnovich later went on to serve as an Assistant United States Attorney for the District of Arizona where he prosecuted public integrity crimes, as well as crimes occurring in Indian Country.

Brnovich has also been a Judge Pro Tem of Maricopa County Superior Court, a Command Staff Judge Advocate in the U.S. Army National Guard, the Director for Constitutional Government at the Goldwater Institute, and the Director of the Arizona Department of Gaming, a law enforcement agency that investigates illegal gambling activity, as well as working with tribal regulators to ensure the integrity of tribal gaming.

Brnovich is known for restoring public confidence in the office of "Arizona's Top Cop" and for assembling some of the nation's most talented public servants for his administration. Mark argued at the United States Supreme Court in defense of the "one-person, one-vote" principle, was featured on 60 Minutes in defense of capital punishment, and has initiated national public education efforts to combat human sex trafficking.

Brnovich has been recognized by the National Federation of Independent Business as a "Champion of Small Business." and was elected by his bi-partisan colleagues to serve as the Chairman of the Conference of Western Attorneys General.

Mark's wife Susan was recently appointed by the United States Senate to serve as a U.S. District Judge for the District of Arizona. He has two teenage daughters and lives in Phoenix.

In 2006, David and I traveled with a group of community leaders to Washington, DC for a special program at the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum. While the program at the Museum was excellent, one of the highlights of the trip was a private meeting with Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, now and forever known as "RBG".

Even though most of us at this meeting were worlds away in our political views, it was an extraordinary meeting. After we went through security at the U.S. Supreme Court building, we were escorted into a very large library conference room.



After about 15 minutes, I walked Justice Ginsburg. She was alone, no security or escorts, and one of the tiniest women I'd ever seen. She very graciously asked us to sit down, and then she proceeded to talk to us about some of the Court's upcoming cases. After she spoke for a while, she then asked if we had any questions. Many did have questions, but there is one question I will never forget. Kenton Jones, at that time a local attorney, asked Justice Ginsburg what she liked to do for fun and relaxation. Without hesitation, she told us she loved opera and every now and then she would be invited to 'step in' at the Kennedy Center to participate in an opera. She then told us the second thing she enjoyed was water skiing! I couldn't imagine this tiny little woman with the huge glasses on a pair of water skis.

After a lengthy, many year battle with cancer, Justice Ginsburg has now passed away. And, while I was on the totally opposite side of her politically, I will never forget how gracious she was to visitors from a small town she had never heard of. Rest in peace "RBG".

REPUBLICAN WOMEN OVER THE YEARS; HOW WE'VE WORKED TOGETHER TO WIN IMPORTANT ELECTIONS

An Inspirational Message from Jan Smith, Past President

On January 1 1966, I became a member of the California Republican Federated Women's Club with 75 members in Highland Park, CA. I soon discovered I was the baby, only 29 years old, where the average age of the members was 72. I became their student and they were equipped to teach me the ropes. I had worked for Goldwater for President, was a Precinct Captain and was one of Ronald Reagan's troop for his election that year.

Wow, was I in for a ride with these "gals"! They volunteered me and told me what, when, where and how to do the assigned task.

Within the first year, I served on the Bylaws, Campaign and Hospitality Committees. The second year I was elected Secretary and also appointed as the Assembly District Precinct Chairman and served for 5 years. I served in 4 HPRW elected offices and several committees, over the time I spent in California.



The one effort I undertook was the proudest of all my political volunteering. I volunteered to go to Monterey and work on a special election for an Assembly seat in May, 1969. I recruited helpers to join me walking precincts for the win. We chartered a plane (Burbank into Monterey) for 170 workers. Our candidate, Clare Berryhill, was an underdog with only a 20% chance of winning. He won the election by just 50 votes. Gov. Reagan now had a tied vote in the Assembly with Clare's election win. Gov. Reagan flew into Monterey to thank the volunteers. I recruited him for the next special election in San Diego County and I had the privilege of working a precinct with Gov. Reagan for our second win in San Diego. Our "Air Troop" went on to win 2 more special elections which gave the Governor a majority in both houses.

In 1997, we moved to Prescott and I joined RWOP in 1998. I served in elected offices including President in 2006, as well as chairing various committees. I served as a Precinct Committee member, Treasurer and 2nd Vice Chair until I was elected YAVGOP County Chair in April 2006 through 2010.

One person can make a difference which I have proven in 1969 with Clare Berryhill's election. If we don't volunteer to help in things we believe in, we are doing the work of the "devil" otherwise spelled Democrat.

Commit yourself to your beliefs, get up, move around and be involved with your time, energy and the donation dollars that are better spent electing good people than all the shopping in the world.

Now let's get out there and work together to reelect President Trump and elect the team he needs to support him. – SCC

Legislative Update – Deborah Pernice

FEDERAL:

Health Insurance Reform:

The House has passed the Competitive Health Insurance Reform Act which, according to Rep. Gosar, "would restore the application of federal antitrust and competition laws to the health insurance industry".

Last Congress, Rep. Gosar was the sponsor of this legislation which passed the House 416-7 but did not receive consideration in the Senate and therefore was not signed into law. This Congress, with a Democrat-controlled House, Rep. Gosar co-led the effort with a Democrat colleague and has continued to fight for another chance to present the bill to President Trump for his signature.

It will establish transparency and enhance consumer protections, while promoting access to affordable health insurance.



Covid Relief:

Congress has still not reached agreement for further economic relief from shutdowns and other economic setbacks caused by the Chinese virus. Formal talks broke down in August and have not officially resumed. The focal point of the issues is the total cost of the bill and how the money should be spent. The White House has hinted it could go up to \$1.5 trillion, while the Democrats have come down from their initial \$3 trillion proposal to \$2.2 trillion, so there has been incremental progress.

Reportedly, these are among the Left's priorities indicated in its recent finance appropriations:

- More than \$170 billion for the Chinese Communist Party
- \$20 billion to Iran, the world's foremost state sponsor of terrorism
- \$17 billion for Bashar Al-Assad in Syria
- \$75 billion to the Russian government
- \$20 billion for the Maduro regime in Venezuela
- Democrats rejected amendments offered by Congressmen French Hill (AR-2) and Bill Huizenga (MI-2) to restrict Iran's access to financing.

President Trump's Executive Orders remain in the offing:

- Extension of the federal unemployment supplement at a reduced rate of \$400 per week
- Payroll tax holiday through the end of the year for Americans earning less than \$100,000
- Extension of student loan relief: Suspends federal student loan payments and sets interest rates to 0 percent through Dec. 31, 2020. The current student loan relief programs were to expire on Sept. 30.
- Identify available funds to "provide temporary financial assistance to renters and homeowners who, as a result of the financial hardships caused by COVID-19, are struggling to meet their monthly rental or mortgage obligations."

Democrat threats to oppose these Executive Orders through litigation have not yet materialized.

There is still time for Congress to pass a new stimulus package before November 3. Last Day to pass the Senate is October 9.
