My move to Prescott from Oahu in early 2022 was with a sense of purpose to serve a community and prevent the encroachment of overreaching state government policies with other like-minded people. As a project development consultant in the Hawaii renewable energy business, my work involved extensive Community Outreach to educate and find creative ways to provide help to the local communities. My recent volunteer work included serving as a co-founder of Ho'ola Na Pua, a 501C-3 whose mission was to fund and build a 32-bed residential treatment facility for underage girls recovered from sex trafficking on Oahu. It also included statewide education on local sex trafficking issues, initiating a mentoring program, and volunteer coordination for all aspects of the organization. Following that, I helped start the Aloha Freedom Coalition to educate and support people resisting C-19 restrictions and government coercive tactics. I have a son who also lives in Prescott, and two stepsons and families living in California, where I lived for three decades prior to moving to Hawaii.
